Clemson University is off of I-85 in Clemson, SC. It can also be reached via the nearest regional airport, the Greenville-Spartanburg Airport.

Holtzendorff Hall: Starting from Alumni/Visitors Center and adjacent Alumni Circle turn left onto North Palmetto Boulevard; travel on North Palmetto Boulevard for 0.10 mile; turn left onto Daniel Drive; travel on Daniel Drive for 0.06 mile; turn left onto Sherman Street; travel on Sherman Street for 0.05 mile; turn right onto Highway 93; travel on Highway 93 for 0.14 mile; turn left into parking lot; travel on parking lot for 0.03 mile; then turn left into Holtzendorff Hall.
